Skateboard and foot scooter rider safety guidelines

Engadine West Public School encourages all students and their families to be safe active travellers. This guide outlines our expectations of students as skateboard and foot scooter riders when travelling to and from school.

Transport for NSW advises:

- primary school-aged children and younger should be supervised by an adult while riding their foot scooter or skatehoard
- primary school-aged children and younger should not use their foot scooter or skateboard on the road
- foot scooter and skateboard riders should wear a helmet and protective gear such as knee pads, wrist guards and elbow pads
- foot scooter and skateboard riders must obey the rules.

Personal e-scooters are illegal on NSW roads and road-related areas, including footpaths, shared paths and bicycle lanes. You can only use these on private property.

Parents and carers are responsible for:

- how their child travels to and from school
- maintaining their child's foot scooter or skateboard
- ensuring their child wears adequate protective gear, including an <u>Australian or overseas standards</u> approved helmet, knee pads, wrist guards and elbow guards
- teaching their child the foot scooter and skateboard rider rules
- completing the Parent/carer and student foot scooter and skateboard rider safety agreement.

Students who ride foot scooters and skateboards to school are responsible for:

- completing the Parent/carer and child foot scooter and skateboard rider safety agreement
- dismounting before entering school grounds
- using the school entry and exit points and walking foot scooters and skateboards on school grounds
- storing foot scooters and skateboards in the bicycle rack behind the library.

Foot scooters, skateboards and helmets are brought and stored at school at the owner's risk.

Parents and carers will be notified if their child does not follow the conditions of the school's foot scooter and skateboard rider safety guidelines and agreement.

Students may be banned from bringing their foot scooter or skateboard onto school grounds if they breach school rules.

Evaluation

These guidelines will be reviewed annually as part of the school's three-year review cycle.

Guide to scooter maintenance: eight-point safety-check

Nuts and bolts	tight wheel bolts Note: Scooters won't go faster with loose nuts. Wheels can fall off.		

Guide to skateboard maintenance: six-point safety-check

Wheels	firm, round wheelsno bulges, cuts or flat spots		
Bearings	clean and lubricated		
Deck	clean deckgrip tape intact and effective		
Nuts and bolts	tight wheel bolts Note: Skateboards won't go faster with loose nuts. Wheels can fall off.
