Live Life Well

Be Active Everyday

Physical activity means to move the body. Exercise classes, dance, sports, games, everyday playing, swimming, skating, cycling, active play, skipping and walking are all activities which keep adults and children healthy.

How Much Physical Activity is Enough?

The "National Physical Activity Guidelines for Australians" recommend at least 60 minutes of moderate to vigorous physical activity on most days, preferably everyday for children.

Be active with your children

Walk with them to or from school, play frisbee, ride a bike or go swimming with them. Children learn by example.

Head Lice

Once again evidence of Pediculosis (head lice) has been found in the K-6 areas of our school. To prevent the spread, we ask you to please examine your child's hair thoroughly in good light, particularly around the hairline and ears. If there is any evidence of head lice or eggs treatment should be applied. It is usually necessary to apply the treatment twice – first to kill the lice and then a few days later to kill the eggs. If the second treatment is not applied it is likely they will reinfect.

Some facts that may assist you:

- ★ The most likely areas of the hair to observe lice are the nape of the neck, behind the ears and where the hair is thickest.
- ★ Lice lay their eggs near the scalp. If a small white spot or egg (nit) is found, it will be "cemented" to the hair and therefore will not slide off easily. Sometimes using your fingernails to slide the egg down the hair shaft is needed. Search blonde heads very carefully because the eggs are hard to see. NB Dandruff will blow away!
- ★ If evidence is found, a chemist will recommend a solution suitable for treating the hair. Washing the hair is only part of the treatment the eggs also need to be removed with a special extra-fine toothed comb or your fingernails.
- ★ Everyone's hair (including parents) should be checked.

Pediculosis is a common school occurrence and should not be a problem if it is dealt with quickly and effectively. For persistent cases please consult your doctor for further advice.

If at any time infestation is found in your child's hair, please inform the school. We appreciate your assistance in making regular checks of your children's hair. Only with your cooperation can we hope to control Pediculosis in our community.

Chicken Pox

There has been a case of Chicken Pox recently reported in the school. Please see the list of symptoms below:

Chickenpox is a viral illness caused by the herpes zoster virus (also known as the Varicella-Zoster virus) In children it usually causes a relatively mild illness. Chickenpox in adults and immunosuppressed people can be severe. Infection in pregnancy can cause foetal malformations, skin scarring, and other problems in the baby.

What are the symptoms?

- Chickenpox begins with a sudden onset of slight fever, runny nose, feeling generally unwell and a skin rash.
- The rash usually begins as small lumps that turn into blisters and then scabs.
- The rash appears over three to four days. At any one time, the lesions of the rash vary in stages of development.
- Symptoms usually occur two weeks after exposure to the virus.
- Most people recover without complications, but sometimes the infection can lead to serious complications, such as pneumonia and inflammation of the brain. Rarely, the infection can be fatal.

How is it spread?

- Early in the illness, the virus is spread by coughing.
- Later in the illness, the virus is spread by direct contact with the fluid in the blisters.
- The infection is highly contagious to people who have never had chickenpox or who have not been immunised.
- People are infectious from one or two days before the rash appears (that is, during the runny nose phase) and up to five days after (when the blisters have formed crusts or scabs)
- Chickenpox infection triggers an immune response and people rarely get chickenpox twice.

Your general practitioner can advise on ways to minimise the discomfort associated with the symptoms of infection. Chickenpox infection usually resolves without treatment.



Due to the success of last years school holiday groups, Capable Kids will be running the following groups in the January School Holidays at Engadine & Helensburgh.
