Money and Valuables at School

Students should not bring valuable items including iPods or toys to school. It is DEC policy that students do not bring mobile telephones to school. Should this occur the telephone will be confiscated by the staff and kept in a secure location for collection at the end of the day by the child or parent as required. Jewellery, including necklaces, brace-lets and rings, are not part of the school uniform and are best left at home. Girls should wear studs in pierced ears instead of earrings.

From time to time students will be asked to bring money for payments for such things as excursions or special programs. Money and permission notes should be in clearly marked envelopes and given to the class teacher first thing in the morning where a record of payments will be made.

Other apps that are soon to be trialled for classroom use include Garage Band, iMovie and Explain Everything. Classes will be given the opportunity to use the iPads to enhance student learning in the coming year.


