NSW Department of Primary Industries Recreational Fisheries' Primary Schools Program

About the program

Get Hooked... It's Fun to Fish encourages children to take an active role in the management of their waterways and fish stocks. The program is designed for Yr 3 to Yr 6 students (Stages 2 and 3) in all NSW primary schools.

During the course of this program, primary school students are introduced to freshwater and marine fishing and aims to:

- provide students with the basic skills necessary for recreational fishing with the view that it will become a lifelong interest.
- introduce students to the concept of sustaining quality aquatic habitats by practicing safe and responsible fishing.
- allow all NSW primary schools equitable access to the program.

So what are the Six Codes all about?

Get Hooked... It's Fun to Fish comprises six teaching modules which form a Junior Fishing Code. Each code is based on principles from the National Fishing Code of Practice by RecFish Australia. A brief description of what students learn about in the 6 Junior Fishing Codes is outlined below.

Code 1 'Take only what you need' - The importance of the food chain and how taking too many of one species of fish may affect the entire chain, so only take enough for your own immediate needs.

Code 2 'Fish with friends' - Safety near waterways, awareness of safe fishing conditions and also the importance of always having a responsible fishing friend to go fishing with you.

Code 3 'You're the solution to water pollution' - How to identify and reduce the impact their actions may have on waterways, in particular the impact litter can have on aquatic species.

Code 4 'Put the little ones back' - Students investigate the rules and regulations that relate to the size of fish you are allowed to catch and why we need to keep certain species and sizes of fish for the future.

Code 5 'Don't leave your tackle behind' - Students develop an understanding of the ways they can reduce the risk to aquatic species by ensuring they are responsible and careful fishers with a respect to the environment they are fishing in.

Code 6 'Quality catchments equal quality fish' - Students investigate the complex nature of a catchment and develop an understanding of the impacts of human activity in one waterway and how it can impact the entire catchment.
