# **COSOTP Year 4 Science and Sustainability Day 2018**

On Thursday 30th of November 2017 we went with Brodie, Anders, Kyson, Thomas, Daniel from our school and 60 students from across our community of schools to a science and sustainability day at the Royal National Park Environmental Education Centre. High school students led workshops called, Totally Rubbish, Wise Water Wise Waste, Bush Tucker and Butterfly Gardening. We also learnt about compost, worms and what you put down a drain and what you don't put down a drain.

So what do you put down a drain? You can put anything in except, paint, slime, but not things like microbeads and hair. Why? Because that stuff can easily go down the drain. Microbeads are toxic and can kill animals and fish. When learning about bush tucker we were shown food from the bush you can eat. They also told us that you can't just eat any type of bush food. Don't just eat anything if you don't know if it's ripe or not.

At Totally Rubbish we learnt about what was general waste and recycling waste. We made badges about recycling and did a race who was the fastest at putting in recycling and general waste. We had five minutes to see how much we could get in a bucket.

At Butterfly Garden we made some plants. We then put them in the garden and at the end we took them home. In the afternoon we went to learn about worms and compost bins and other animals that live in the compost. We tried to get worms in our containers. We got several worms into the container. We also got an apple in our tub. There were millions of worms in one big container.

At the very end of the day we made a slide show of what we remembered throughout the day. Before we left we had a presentation where everybody that attended got an award. Then we went home.
